Project and Budget Status Report

The departments of finance and advancement at Olds College and Chinook's Edge School Division have worked diligently over the course of the CLC project. To that end, the Community Learning Campus is pleased to announce that the budget is now balanced.

Executive Director's Report and Community Engagement Site Report

Construction is nearing completion at the newly named Ralph Klein Centre, which houses the Olds High School, three gymnasiums, an elevated indoor track, fitness centre, integrated career centre, health services, and the offices for Central Alberta Child and Family Services Authority and Alberta Employment and Immigration (also known as Alberta Works). The target date for the government agencies move is February 16, 2010, while the high school plans to move into their new location on February 22, 2010.

Currently, Community Engagement Sites are fully operational in the communities of Bowden, Cremona, Delburne, Drumheller, Innisfail, Red Deer, Stettler, and Sundre. In 2010, sites will be opened in the communities Carstairs, Didsbury, Elnora, Olds, Penhold, Spruce View and Sylvan Lake. The Community Engagement Site Coordinators and the CLC team continue to work on providing these communities with meaningful and relevant programming.
